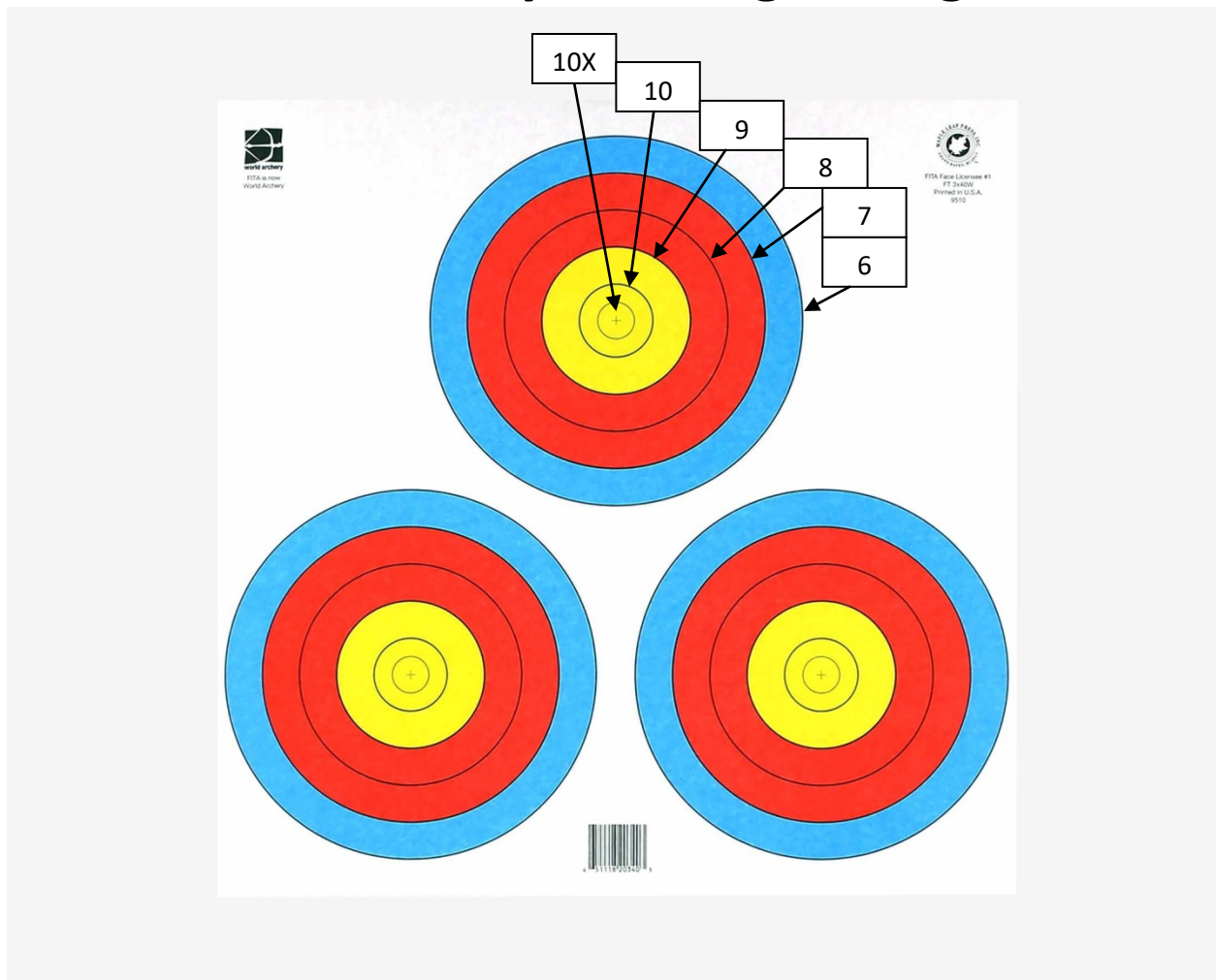


WWF Archery Fun Target League



This is how we will score the Vegas 3 Spot targets

Week 1 (Jan 12th Registration) Distances: Adult (M & F) 20 yards, Instinctive (Genesis) or Youth 10 yards

Week 2 (Jan 17th to 19th) Distances: Adult (M & F) 20 yards, Instinctive (Genesis) or Youth 15 yards

Week 3 (Jan 24th to 26rd) Distances: Adult (M & F) 30 yards, Instinctive (Genesis) or Youth 20 yards

Week 4 (Jan 31th to Feb 2th) Distances: Adult (M & F) 20 yards, Instinctive (Genesis) or Youth 15 yards

Week 5 (Feb 7th to 9th) Distances: Adult (M & F) 40 yards, Instinctive (Genesis) or Youth 20 yards

Week 6 (Feb 14th to 16st) Distances: Adult (M & F) 20 yards, Instinctive (Genesis) or Youth 10 yards

Week 7 (Feb 21th to 23th) Distances: Adult (M & F) 30 yards, Instinctive (Genesis) or Youth 15 yards

Week 8 (Feb 28th to Mar 1st) Distances: Adult (M & F) 40 yards, Instinctive (Genesis) or Youth 20 yards

RANGE IS CLOSED AS OF WEDNESDAY Mar 11th TO SET UP FOR INDOOR 3D SHOOT

(Mar 14TH & 15TH)

Week 9 (Mar 20th to 22nd) Distances: Adult (M & F) 20 yards, Instinctive (Genesis) or Youth 10 yards

Week 10 (Mar 27th to 29th) Distances: Adult (M & F) 30 yards, Instinctive (Genesis) or Youth 20 yards

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Round Basics

Target: All Divisions will shoot on either the 40 cm Vegas three-spot target face (10x-10-9-8-7-6) scoring areas and Pee wee to Cadet the 40 cm single-spot face with 10 through 1 scoring.

The x-ring will be used for tiebreak. If more than 1 archery is shooting at a target, after the fifth end the target faces are changed from bottom to top or vice versa.

Distance for all Divisions: Masters to Junior distances will be 20 Yards to 40 yards and will change weekly. Cadet to Pee Wee will be 10 to 20 yards and will change weekly.

Rounds: Round can be shot on Friday, Saturday and Sunday will consist of 10 ends; 3 arrows per end (All rounds must be complete by Wednesday night at the latest so scores can be posted by Friday morning so they can be posted).

Round Rules: Reminder this is a Fun Target League to get archer together for fun and camaraderie. There is no prizes just the bragging rights

1. Archers may only register in ONE division and style and will remain in the same division for the full 10 weeks.

2. Division winners will be determined by the highest total score from all ten weeks. The total number of x-ring will break ties.

If there is still a tie a 20 yard shoot off will be schedule. The shoot off will include one practice-end followed by end-by-end sudden death. The person with the lowest score after each end will be eliminated until a winner is awarded.

3. In the event of equipment failure the archer will stop shooting. All arrows shot before the equipment fail will count to that round. Once the equipment failure is repair the shooter may start where they stopped. If equipment failure isn't corrected before the Wednesday night dead line, whatever the score is, is the score that will be recorded for that week.

4. Picture of your score sheet and picture of your target must be text or e-mailed to Morley Forsgren (306-861-0843 or email firemoe@sasktel.net) by Thursday (Noon) before the next weeks shoot. If a score is not sent the archer will receive a zero for that week. Scores will be posted on our Facebook page.

Age Divisions (Men and women for each class):

PeeWee	9 and under
Pre-cub	12 and under
Cub	14 and under
Cadet	17 and under
Junior	20 and under
Senior	21 to 49
Master	50+

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Target Archery Equipment Classification Divisions

Recurve:

- An adjustable arrow rest may be used
- One draw check indicator, audible or visible may be used but cannot be electronic
- A bow site may be used but not more than 1 device (no peeps)
- Stabilizers may be used
- Arrows may not exceed 9.3mm (23 series)

Barebow:

- An adjustable arrow rest may be used
- No sights permitted
- No draw check indicators allowed
- No stabilizers permitted
- Arrows may not exceed 9.3mm (23 series)

Hunter Class:

- Max draw weight of 80lbs for men, 60lbs for women & 40lbs for Pre-Cub and PeeWee
- An adjustable rest may be used
- A multi pin fiber optic sight may be used (sights MAY NOT be adjusted once on the course and sights SHALL NOT incorporate any lens whether magnifying or not)
- Arrows must have screw in tips
- Only 1 stabilizer permitted and cannot exceed 12 inches

Compound Fixed Pins:

- Max draw weight of 80lbs for men, 60lbs for women & 40lbs for Pre-Cub and PeeWee
- An adjustable rest may be used
- A multi pin fiber optic sight may be used (sights MAY NOT be adjusted once on the course and sights SHALL NOT incorporate any lens whether magnifying or not). Lighted sites may be used
- Stabilizers of any length are permitted
- There is no arrow restriction for this particular class

Compound:

- Max draw weight of 60lbs for Men & Women. 40lbs max for Pre-Cub and Pee Wee
- An adjustable rest may be used
- A multi pin or single pin sight may be used (sight adjustments and a lens are permitted in this class) Lighted sights however ARE NOT permitted
- Stabilizers are of any length are permitted
- Arrows may not exceed 9.3mm (23 series)

Compound Unlimited:

- Max draw weight of 80lbs for men, 60lbs for women & 40lbs for Pre-Cub and PeeWee
- An adjustable rest may be used
- A multi pin or single pin sight may be used (sight adjustments and a lens are permitted in this class) Lighted sights ARE permitted in this class
- Stabilizers are of any length are permitted
- There are no arrow restrictions for this class
